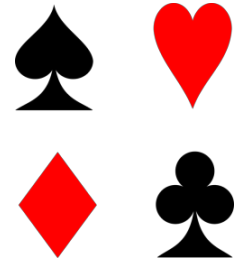

Charlie - always - (to) jump - into the river - (to) swim around. Grandma - (to) cook lunch - dog - (to) sleep - garden. Later - they - (to) eat - cake - - Tom - (to) play with - grandma. Tom - Charlie - never - (to) go home - before 6 o' clock.

Tom often plays with his dog in the park. He throws sticks and Charlie brings them. Tom sometimes reads comics and the dog runs around in the park. Sundays Tom visits his grandma. In the morning he always buys a cake for grandma. Then he walks along the river to her house. Charlie always jumps into the river and swims around. Grandma cooks lunch and the dog sleeps in the garden. Later they eat the cake and Tom plays with grandma. Tom and Charlie never go home before 6 o' clock.
